Another year has come and gone. I am glad to be around to see 2015. Just a reminder, be sure to disconnect your garden hose from the outside faucet. If the faucet seems loose on its mount, tip it down to let the water drain out. This will prevent it from freezing.

For special garbage pick-ups on Mondays you must notify the office. Garbage from private parties at the rec hall should be put in the dumpster at the office for pick up.

Remove the sign when you are ready to be dug out and the roads are plowed. Last year a lot of people were dug out before we finished plowing and got plowed back in. If it is not an emergency, please wait till we are done plowing.

Please do not put garbage containers in the street the night before a storm. PLACE THEM OFF THE ROAD EDGE. All garbage must be in an enclosed container, not in plastic bags. This is in your lease.
