## Selling your Home?

# COOKS' CORNER

Pumpkin Fest: Any way you scooo it, fall's prize ingredient is too good to resist. Bake it, spice it or make it snacky.

## Savory Pumpkin Quiche

Prep.15min: Bake: 50 min. Makes 8 servings
3 large eggs 1 can(15oz.) solid -pack pumpkin, 1 can (5oz.) evaporated milk, $3 / 4$ cup cooked crumbled bacon, $1 / 2$ cup sliced mushrooms, $1 / 4$ cup finely chopped onion, $1 / 4$ cup finely chopped green pepper, $1 / 2$ cup grated Parmesan cheese, Tbsp. All- purpose flour, 1 frozen deep-dish pie shell.

1. Preheat oven to 375. In a bowl, whisk eggs, pumpkin and milk. Stir in bacon, mushrooms, onion, and pepper. Toss cheese with flour, stir into egg mixture. Pour into pie shell.
2. Bake on a lower oven rack 50-60 minutes or until a knife inserted near the center comes out clean.

Let stand 15 minutes before cutting.

## Black Bean and Pumpkin Chili

Prep. 20 min. Cook 1 hour Makes 8 servings.
1 Tbsp. Olive oil: 1 sweet yellow pepper, chopped 1 medium onion, chopped 3 garlic cloves, minced 3 cups reduced sodium chicken broth ,1 can ( 15 oz .) solid pack Pumpkin, 1 can (14oz) diced tomatoes, undrained 2 tsp , Chilling powder: $1 / 2 \mathrm{tsp}$. Ground cumin, $11 / 2 \mathrm{tsp}$. Dried oregano, $1 / 2 \mathrm{tsp}$. Salt, $1 / 2 \mathrm{tsp}$ Smoked paprika, 2 cans ( 15 oz . each) black beans, rinsed and drained, $11 / 2$ cups shredded cooked chicken, $1 / 4$ cup chopped fresh cilantro.

1. In a 6- quart stock pot, heat oil over medium heat. Add pepper and onions, cook and stir 6-8 minutes or until tender. Stir in garlic, cook 1 minute.
2. Stir in broth, pumpkin, tomatoes and seasonings. Mash one can of beans. Add mashed beans and the remaining can of beans to pot, bring to a boil. Reduce heat, simmer, covered, 45 minutes to allow flavors to blend, stirring occasionally. Stir in chicken and cilantro, heat through.

This is a very thick hearty Chili. Great source of fiber.
