Selling your Home?

- It is important to recognize that a home sale in a land lease community is different than a traditional real estate sale, and many outside brokers are not familiar with the process. Our staff are experts in these type of transactions and can handle the sale of your home in a smooth and efficient manner.

From The Editor

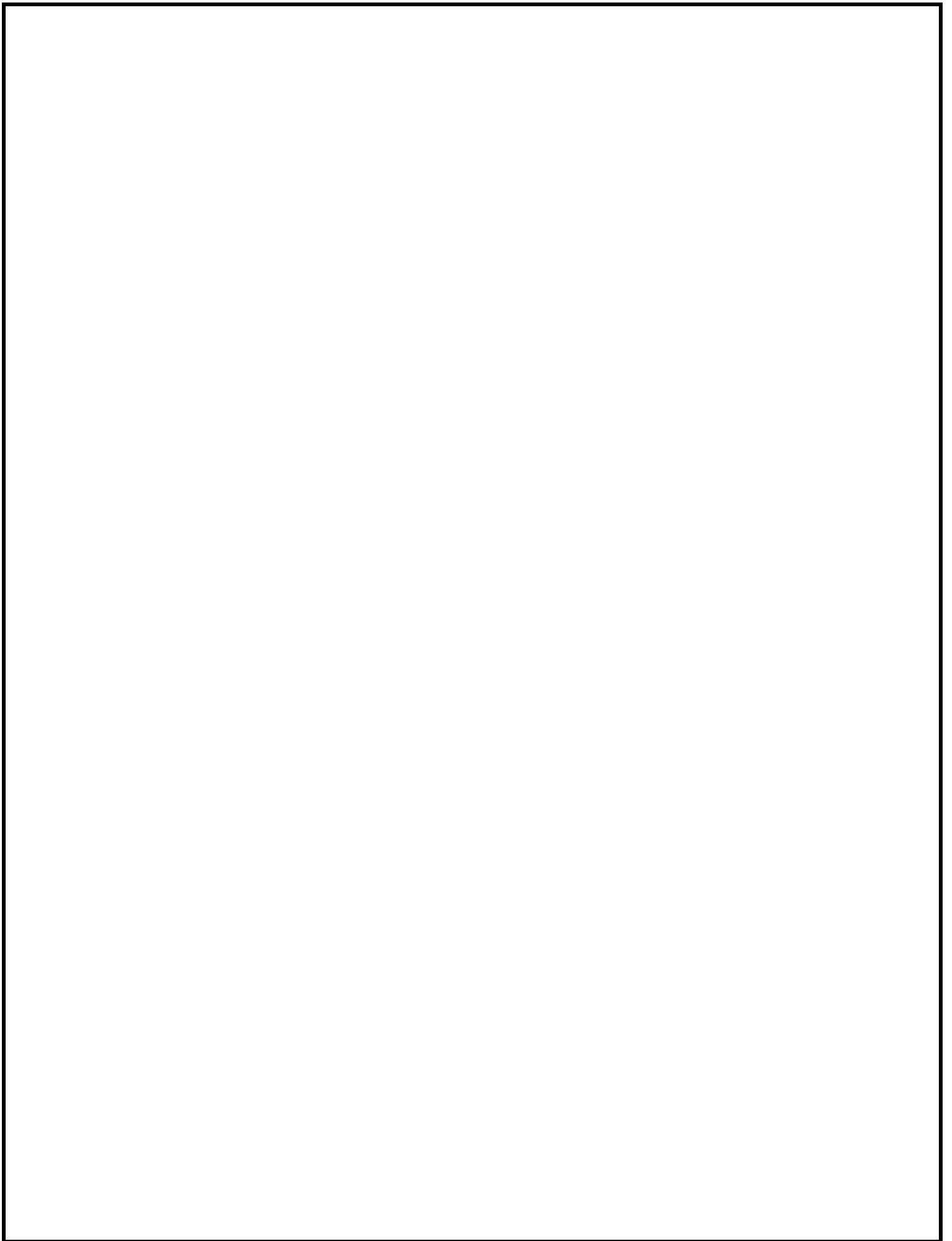

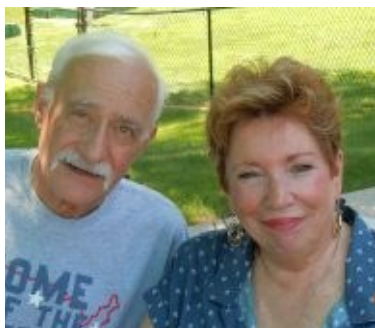
Thank you, Dominick, for your service to our country. And thank you both for all your efforts in making this a great community.

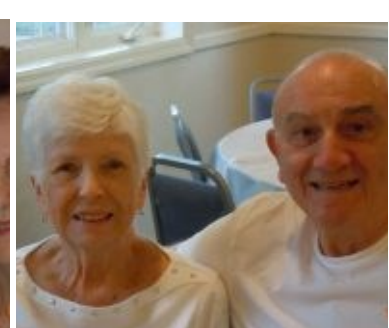
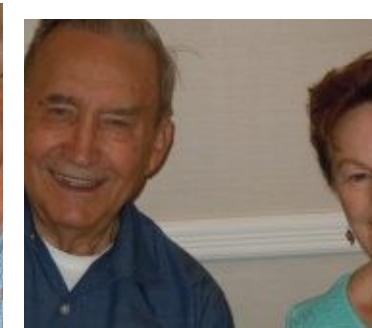

COOKS' CORNER

Pumpkin Fest: Any way you scoop it, fall's prize ingredient is too good to resist. Bake it, spice it or make it snacky.

Savory Pumpkin Quiche

Prep.15min: Bake: 50 min. Makes 8 servings

3 large eggs 1 can(15oz.) solid -pack pumpkin, 1 can (5oz.) evaporated milk, 3/4 cup cooked crumbled bacon, 1/2 cup sliced mushrooms, 1/4 cup finely chopped onion, 1/4 cup finely chopped green pepper, 1/2 cup grated Parmesan cheese, Tbsp. All- purpose flour, 1 frozen deep-dish pie shell.

1. Preheat oven to 375. In a bowl, whisk eggs, pumpkin and milk. Stir in bacon, mushrooms, onion, and pepper. Toss cheese with flour, stir into egg mixture. Pour into pie shell.
2. Bake on a lower oven rack 50-60 minutes or until a knife inserted near the center comes out clean.
Let stand 15 minutes before cutting.

Black Bean and Pumpkin Chili

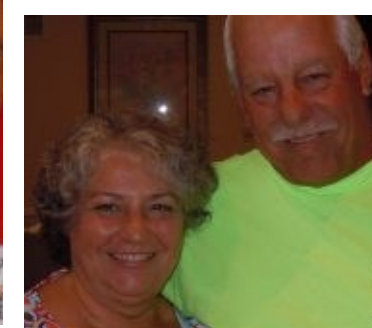
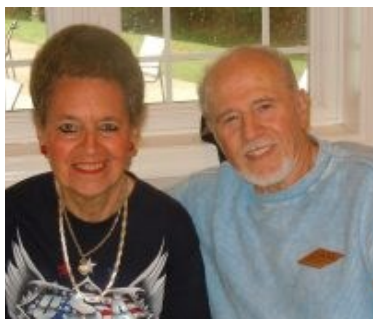
Prep.20 min. Cook 1 hour Makes 8 servings.

1 Tbsp. Olive oil: 1 sweet yellow pepper, chopped 1 medium onion, chopped 3 garlic cloves, minced 3 cups reduced sodium chicken broth ,1 can (15 oz.) solid pack Pumpkin, 1 can (14oz) diced tomatoes, undrained 2 tsp, Chilling powder: 1/2 tsp. Ground cumin, 1 1/2 tsp. Dried oregano, 1/2 tsp. Salt, 1/2 tsp Smoked paprika, 2 cans (15 oz. each) black beans, rinsed and drained, 1 1/2 cups shredded cooked chicken, 1/4 cup chopped fresh cilantro.

1. In a 6- quart stock pot, heat oil over medium heat. Add pepper and onions, cook and stir 6-8 minutes or until tender. Stir in garlic, cook 1 minute.
2. Stir in broth, pumpkin, tomatoes and seasonings. Mash one can of beans. Add mashed beans and the remaining can of beans to pot, bring to a boil. Reduce heat, simmer, covered, 45 minutes to allow flavors to blend, stirring occasionally. Stir in chicken and cilantro, heat through.

This is a very thick hearty Chili. Great source of fiber.

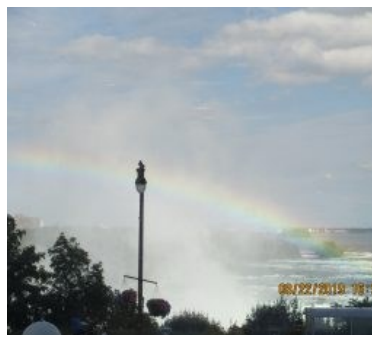

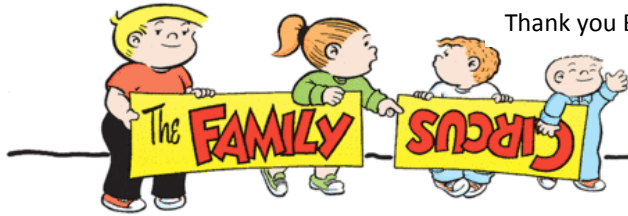
We will need a completed envelope for each Foxtales that you'd like mailed. If you're gone for a few months, enjoy the warm weather.

- April / May issue will be put out April 1st.



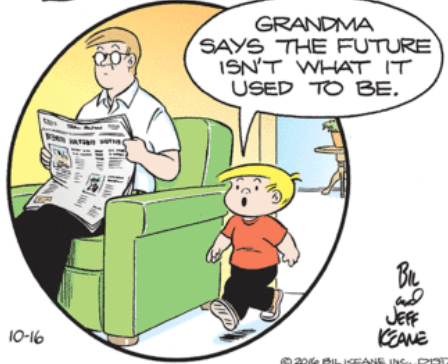
