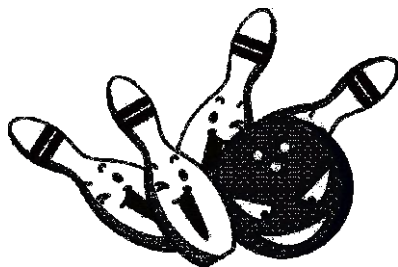

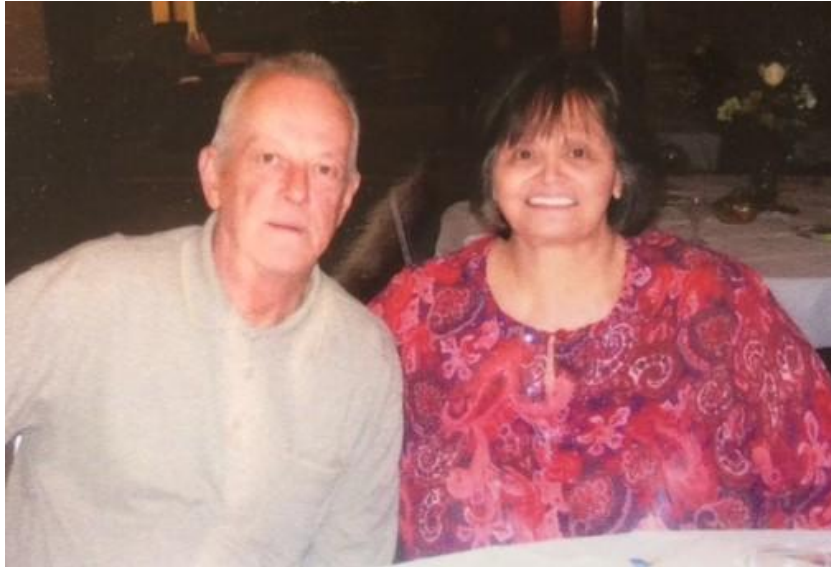


## *RESIDENTS OF THE MONTH*

# Cooks' Corner

With the cold weather setting in we all look for warm comfort dishes. The following Soup will warm you up.

## Mediterranean Fish Soup:

Ingredients: 1 cup medium diced onion. 1 cup Medium diced leeks, white part only. 2/3 cup small diced fennel. 2 oz. minced garlic. 2oz. olive oil plus some for cooking. 1 liter white wine. 6oz. canned tomatoes, squished. 2 quarts fish stock (available at most fish shops). 1 pinch of saffron. 2oz. Fresh chopped thyme. 1 tsp. Smoked paprika. Salt and pepper to taste. 2 tsp. Pernod. 8-15 pieces of monkfish (or another all white hearty fish). 24 small mussels, in shells. 16 small little neck clams. Chopped parsley. Lemon zest



## Directions:

1. Sauté' diced onions, leeks and fennel in 2oz. in olive oil until translucent. Add minced fresh garlic and sauté' until slightly golden.
2. Add squished canned tomatoes and fish stock. Add saffron, fresh chopped thyme, smoked paprika and salt and pepper to taste. Simmer for 40 minutes. Add Pernod and check seasoning.
3. Season monkfish with salt and pepper and sauté' in olive oil and reserve. Add clams to soup broth and cover. Once clams begin to open., add mussels and keep covered until all shells are open. Arrange fish in individual bowls along with warm mussels' and. clams and pour over all.
4. Finish with chopped parsley and zest of fresh lemon rind.
5. Serve with spicy aioli and garlic crostini.

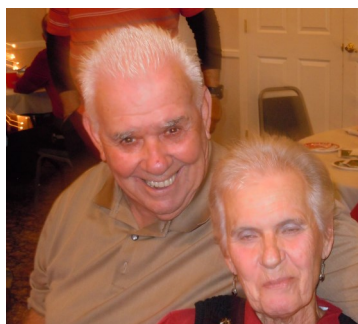
## Spicy Aioli:

Separate 2 eggs. Put two egg yolks in a bowl with 1 teaspoon Dijon mustard and 1 teaspoon fresh chopped garlic. Add one pinch of cayenne pepper and the juice of one lemon. Slowly add oil while whisking until it has a consistency of thin mayo.

Enjoy with a fresh hot loaf of Italian bread.
