# COOK'S CORNER by CATHERINE HANNON



Fast, Fresh, and easy recipes for midweek meals!

## Green Goddess Wraps:

Ingredients. Green cabbage (3 cups finely chopped). Cucumber (finely chopped). Green onions (3/4 cup finely chopped). Pepitas (1/3 cup toasted). Green goddess dressing (3/4 cup). Spinach flour tortillas (6). Avocado (1 mashed). Hard boiled eggs(4sliced). Radishes (1/2 cup thinly sliced).

### Directions:

1. In a large bowl combine cabbage, cucumber, green onions, and pepitas. Add dressing and toss to coat.
  2. Spread tortillas with avocado. Top with eggs, radishes, and cabbage salad. Roll up tightly.
- Makes 6 wraps.

## Tahini Chicken Salad Lettuce Cups:

Ingredients: Tahini (1/4 cup). Lemon Juice(3Tbsp.) Garlic Clove (1 minced). Za'atar spice mix (2 tsp.). Dijon mustard (1 tsp.). Ground cumin (1/2 tsp.). Cooked chicken (2 cups chopped). Celery (1 cup finely chopped). Chives (1/3 cup chopped). Romaine lettuce(6 leaves).Cucumber (1 cup sliced). Grape tomatoes (1 cup chopped).

### Directions:

1. For dressing, in a medium bowl whisk together tahini, lemon juice, garlic, 2 Tbsp. Olive oil , the za'atar, and mustard until well combined. If your tahini is very thick, whisk in cold water ,1 Tbsp. At a time, to reach a smooth, creamy consistency. Whisk in cumin and 1/4 tsp. Salt.
  2. Add chicken, celery, and chives to the dressing. Stir to combine. Fill romaine lettuce leaves with chicken salad and top with cucumber and grape tomatoes. If you like, finish with additional za'atar.
- Makes 6 lettuce cups.

Do yourself a favor and make an extra batch of chicken salad for future lunches.

## Town News

Riverhead has been busy the past few months both inside and outside of Town Hall.

On May 3, a standing room only crowd attended a forum presented by Calverton Aviation and Technology (CAT), the developer for the Calverton site known as EPCAL. Hundreds of attendees packed into the ballroom at the Hotel Indigo that night heard speaker after speaker challenge the CAT representatives with questions and concerns that were answered with vague and unconvincing statements. The community made it clear that we do not want cargo airports and warehouses built in our town. (See [riverheadlocal.com](http://riverheadlocal.com) for full coverage)

The Civic Association sponsored two presentations for the benefit of all concerned residents. On April 28, the different types of warehouses were explained along with the impact of cargo airplanes and trucks on our lives and the lives of our children and grandchildren. The experts who spoke made it clear that nothing should be approved by the Town Board until the Comprehensive Plan is completed. The urgency of community participation in the process of planning for the future cannot be understated. Another request for a moratorium was suggested.

On May 18 the Civic Association hosted a presentation by EPCAL WATCH, a group that has been carefully monitoring the proposed development for at least 6 years. They made it clear that we must increase the numbers of letters and meeting attendees to pressure the government officials into taking action. We can request a referendum on the project. We can ask for a moratorium again. We can write to other government officials outside of Riverhead. Active participation is critical. Please find a way that you can help.
