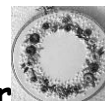

## AN IMPORTANT MESSAGE FROM THE WEBMASTER

We have been trying to maintain a strong email system here in our community. We have successfully been able to bring important information into the homes of so many in the community. We understand that there may come a time when you need to make a change to your email provider and get a new email address. We ask that when you do, that you notify us of the change. Returned emails in a mailing system as large as ours cause us many internal problems as we must determine if there is an internal error or if the problem is your email itself. The easiest way to notify us of a change is to send an email from your new email address to us at [Webmaster@foxwoodvillagehoa.com](mailto:Webmaster@foxwoodvillagehoa.com) and put the new email address in the subject heading. Also, if you are not yet part of our email system but would like to be added to the list. You can also send an email to [webmaster@foxwoodvillagehoa.com](mailto:webmaster@foxwoodvillagehoa.com) and say add my email address in the subject heading. 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Recently I sent an email regarding Scams received by email. There are also scams be sent out by text messages.

People have been receiving emails from US Post Office and UPS. The subject matter is "your package can't be delivered and requires your attention". The idea is that you will respond and give them information that they are going to use against you and maybe get into your accounts.

1. Post Office and UPS do not email or text you regarding package problems. ( unless you have an **online account** with them; then you will get a secure message through your account.)
2. You need to learn how to identify scam mails and texts and what to do with them.

When you receive an email described above or any email alerting you to a problem that seems suspicious DO THE FOLLOWING:

The email will be sent from something like this Example: [UPS@joeshmoo.com](mailto:UPS@joeshmoo.com). Most business' or stores will have their own domain so it would be for example :[UPS@unitedparcel.com](mailto:UPS@unitedparcel.com). IF YOU THINK IT IS SUSPICIOUS click on the email sender: Example [UPS@joeshmoo.com](mailto:UPS@joeshmoo.com) right click on the email address and it will reveal the true senders alias like in this case if you right click on [UPS@joeshmoo.com](mailto:UPS@joeshmoo.com) and you'll get something like this: [jbx@nomail.com](mailto:jbx@nomail.com) which is nothing to do with UPS.

US Post Office has an email service which identifies your daily mail and deliveries. Anyone can sign up. to sign up go to <https://www.usps.com/manage/informed-delivery.htm>. To use this service as an example of Legitimate email senders

I receive daily emails from USPS and it comes as this: **From: USPS Informed Delivery**  
(to verify if it is real if I right click on this email address  
I will see this: **USPSInformedelivery@email.informedelivery.usps.com**  
AS you see the legitimate email has usps.com as its domain.

**WHAT DO YOU DO TO GET RID OF THE SCAM EMAIL:** In the inbox, right click the email listed or in the list of choices above the inbox select **MOVE**. Then in the choices Move the email to **SPAM**>

**DO NOT OPEN ANY LINKS IN SUSPICIOUS EMAILS. DELETING EMAILS IS SAFER THAN OPENING A BAD LINK. IMPORTANT MESSAGES WILL REACH OUT TO YOU ANOTHER WAY IF YOU DON'T RESPOND TO THE EMAIL.**  
**BETTER TO BE SAFE THAN SORRY**

**TEXT MESSAGES:**

The idea is very similar. If you receive a Text you believe is Spam, don't click on any links in the TEXT. At top of the screen click EDIT. Select the TEXT you think is fake and then select **delete**.

**It is better to be safe than sorry. (If it was real, the party will reach out another way)**

**It is my hope this will help you protect yourself from potential scams. Remember if it sounds too good to be true, it most likely is.**

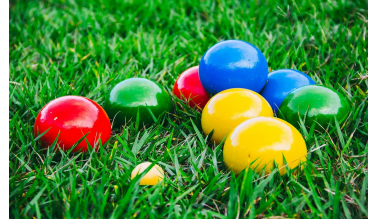

local papers or watching videos of meetings, you've missed some important developments. I will try to point out important news, but it's impossible to write about all the details here. Please do yourself ( and the community) a favor and do some research on your own.

Calverton Aviation & Technology ( CAT) appeared before the IDA for a public information session on August 23 where they once again stated that there would be no cargo airport at EPCAL. Questions about financial status and CAT's ability to actually complete their project were raised, and answers were a bit muddled and evasive. You can watch it on the town's website under channel 22 "on demand."

BFJ, the planners for our Comprehensive Plan addressed the town board in a work session on Sept. 14, and described their impressions on zoning changes and farmland preservation. It was clear to me that they support the reduction of Industrial Zones in Calverton and are supportive of working to keep Calverton green. At the same work session, proposals for moratoriums on industrial development and battery storage systems were presented by Councilman Hubbard. Some board members were supportive, but no action was taken.

At a Candidate's Forum on September 21, Councilman Hubbard indicated that he now has enough support from the board to enact both moratoriums. ( see RiverheadLocal) There is no information as to when the town board may vote on these proposals.

According to a RiverheadLocal article dated September 20, State Senators James Skoufis and Anthony Palumbo commented on Riverhead's IDA stating that the current EPCAL issue before the IDA is inappropriate, irresponsible and improper. It seems that the state is finally paying attention to our dilemma. Let's hope that they will stay aware and act to protect the town from any careless actions by the IDA.
