#### AN IMPORTANT MESSAGE FROM THE WEBMASTER

We have been trying to maintain a strong email system here in our community. We have successfully been able to bring important information into the homes of so many in the community. We understand that there may come a time when you need to make a change to your email provider and get a new email address. We ask that when you do, that you notify us of the change. Returned emails in a mailing system as large as ours cause us many internal problems as we must determine if there is an internal error or if the problem is your email itself. The easiest way to notify us of a change is to send an email from your new email address to us at Webmaster@foxwoodvillagehoa.com and put the new email address in the subject heading. Also, if you are not yet part of our email system but would like to be added to the list. You can also send an email to webmaster@foxwoodvillagehoa.com and say add my email address in the subject heading. We appreciate your cooperation in this matter.

Recently I sent an email regarding Scams received by email. There are also scams be sent out by text messages.

People have been receiving emails from US Post Office and UPS. The subject matter is "your package can't be delivered and requires your attention". The idea is that you will respond and give them information that they are going to use against you and maybe get into your accounts.

- Post Office and UPS do not email or text you regarding package problems. ( unless you have an **online account** with them; then you will get a secure message through your account.)
- 2. You need to learn how to identify scam mails and texts and what to do with them.

When you receive an email described above or any email alerting you to a problem that seems suspicious DO THE FOLLOWING:

The email will be sent from something like this Example: UPS@joeshmoo.com. Most business' or stores will have their own domain so it would be for example :UPS@unitedparcel.com. IF YOU THINK IT IS SUSPICIOUS click on the email sender: Example UPS@joeshmoo.com right click on the email address and it will reveal the true senders alias like in this case if you right click on UPS@joeshmoo.com and you'll get something like this: jbx@nomail.com which is nothing to do with UPS.

US Post Office has an email service which identifies your daily mail and deliveries. Anyone can sign up. to sign up go to <a href="https://www.usps.com/manage/informed-delivery.htm">https://www.usps.com/manage/informed-delivery.htm</a>. To use this service as an example of Legitimate email senders

I receive daily emails from USPS and it comes as this: From: USPS Informed Delivery (to verify if it is real if I right click on this email address I will see this: USPSInformeddelivery@email.informeddelivery.usps.com AS you see the legitimate email has usps.com as its domain.

WHAT DO YOU DO TO GET RID OF THE SCAM EMAIL: In the inbox, right click the email listed or in the list of choices above the inbox select MOVE. Then in the choices Move the email to SPAM>

DO NOT OPEN ANY LINKS IN SUSPICIOUS EMAILS. DELETING EMAILS IS SAFER THAN OPENING A BAD LINK. IMPORTANT MESSAGES WILL REACH OUT TO YOU ANOTHER WAY IF YOU DON'T RESPOND TO THE EMAIL.

BETTER TO BE SAFE THAN SORRY

#### **TEXT MESSAGES:**

The idea is very similar. If you receive a Text you believe is Spam, don't click on any links in the TEXT. At top of the screen click EDIT. Select the TEXT you think is fake and then select **delete**.

It is better to be safe than sorry. (If it was real, the party will reach out another way)

It is my hope this will help you protect yourself from potential scams. Remember if it sounds too good to be true, it most likely is.



"GOBBLE UP LEFTOVERS!"

How to get more mileage out of your holiday meals:

#### **Turkey Pita Pockets:**

Toss together 1/2 cup each sliced cucumber and tomatoes, 1/4 cup sliced red onion,2 Tbsp. Chopped Kalamata olives,2 Tbsp. Olive oil, and 1 Tbsp. Lemon juice in a bowl. Sauté 3 cups cooked turkey with 1 Tbsp. Olive oil and 3/4 tsp. Greek seasoning in a skillet until warm. Divide among 6 pita rounds; add tomato mixture, lettuce, and tzatziki sauce. Serves 6.



#### **Creamy Turkey Pasta Bake:**

Sauté 6 cups sliced collard greens and 3 cups sliced mushrooms with 2 Tbsp. Oil in a skillet over medium heat until tender. Stir in 1 lb. Cooked pasta, 3 cups cooked turkey, 2 1/2 cups cream, 1 1/4 cups Parmesan cheese, 2 tsp. Kosher salt, and 3/4 tsp. Pepper. Transfer to a 13x9 inch baking dish; top with 11/2 cups shredded mozzarella cheese. Bake at 375. For 15 minutes. Serves 8.

#### **Turkey Frittata:**

Sauté 1/2 cup sliced red onion in 1 Tbsp. Olive oil in a 10-inch cast iron skillet or a nonstick skillet over medium heat until tender. Stir in 2 cups cooked vegetables and 1 cup Cooked turkey. Remove from heat. Whisk 12 large eggs ,1 cup shredded Gruyère cheese, 1 tsp. Kosher salt, and 1/2 black pepper in a bowl; pour into skillet. Bake at 400 until set. 18 to 20 minutes. Serves 8.



#### **Barbecue Turkey Sandwiches:**

Bring 1/2 cup barbecue sauce, 1/4 cup cranberry sauce, and 1 Tbsp. Apple cider vinegar to a simmer over medium heat. Cook until slightly thickened, about 5 minutes. Stir in 2 cups cooked turkey. Divide among bottoms of 4 toasted hamburger buns. Add coleslaw and dill pickle slices, and cover with hamburger bun tops. Serves 4.

#### **Town Hall News**

Most of us know that the IDA denied financial assistance to CAT, and, as a result, the Town Board declared the contract with CAT for the EPCAL project null and void. This is a significant victory for the town and a tremendous relief to all the Foxwood community. Don't underestimate the impact of our participation in the struggle to achieve this goal. Public opinion and pressure were noted on the record by the IDA and the board. Your voices were heard, and we did make a difference!

We must continue the fight if we want to block the construction of massive warehouses in our neighborhood. Hopefully, by the time you read this, the Moratorium will be in effect, and we will have the gift of time to work towards the changes needed to reach our goals.

The planners (BFJ) are working diligently on the Comprehensive Plan for Riverhead. It's critical that we let them know where we stand on industrial zoning and warehousing. There will be a public workshop on Wednesday, December 13, 2023, from 6:00 to 8:00 PM at the new town hall. Go to: townofriverheadcomprehensiveplanupdate.com/ for more information.
